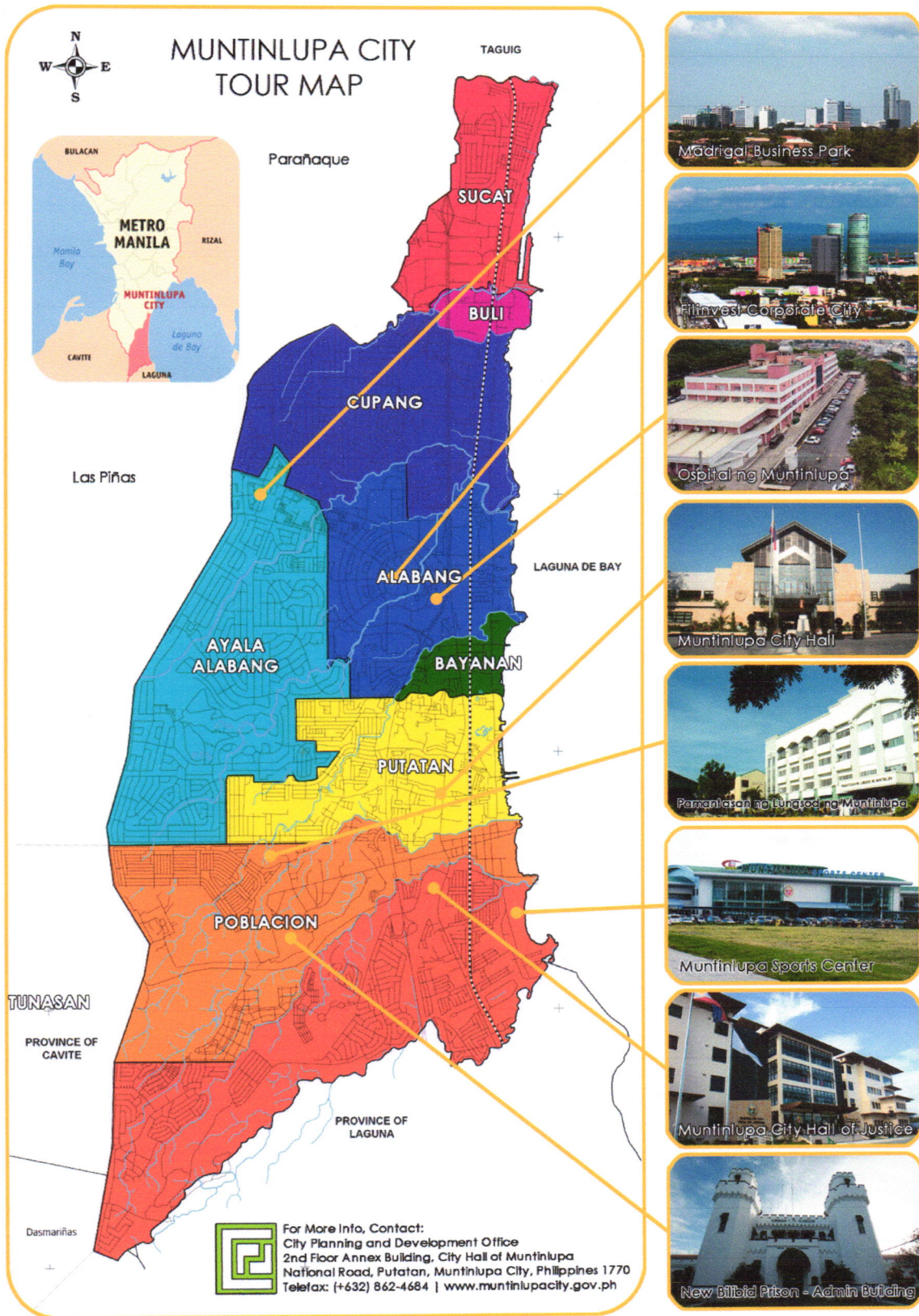

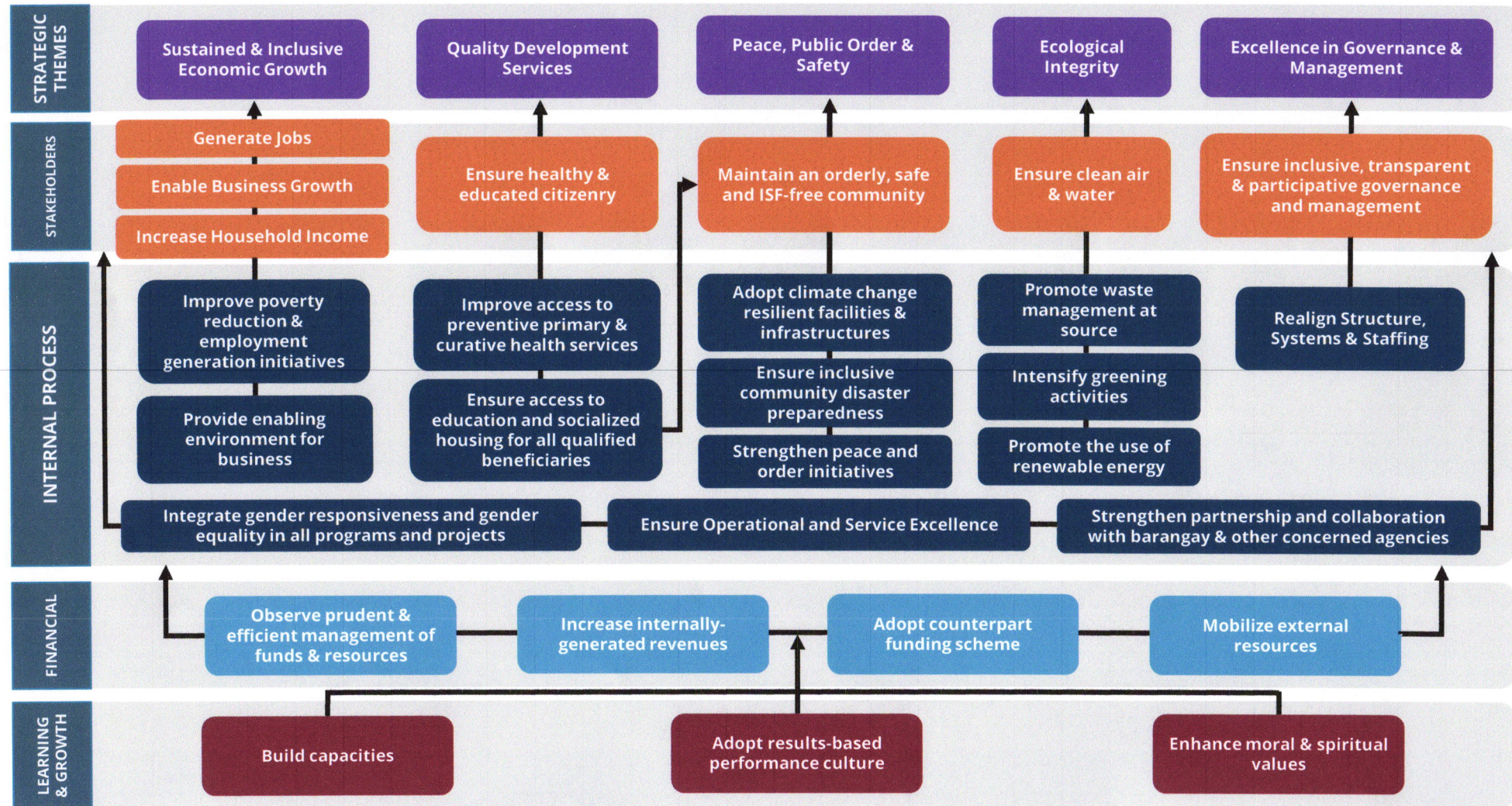

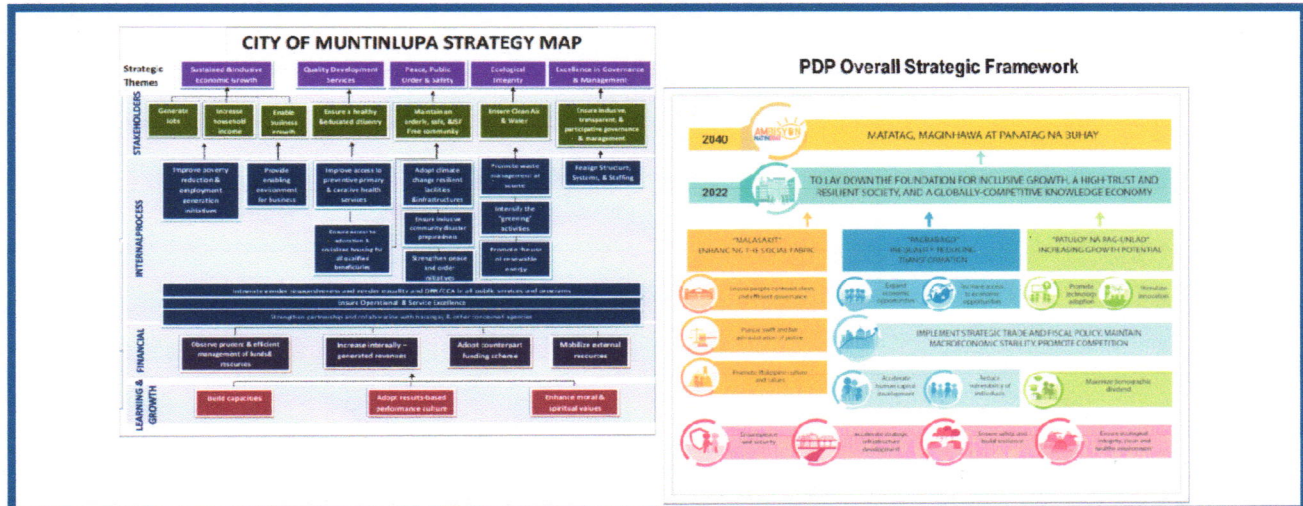

### 2.1.

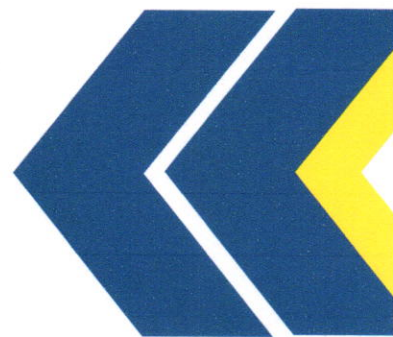
The process of formulating the Executive and Legislative Agenda comprised with a workshop involving both the Executive branch and Legislative Branch of the City Government of Muntinlupa through the coordinative facilitation of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the City Planning and Development Office (CPDO).

With the primary basis of strategic direction from the already approved Comprehensive Land Use Plan 2016-2026 and corresponding approved Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) 2017-2023 of the City of Muntinlupa, its Local Development Investment Plan 2018-2019, and Annual Investment Programming, supported by the series of sectoral planning consultations and workshops with both internal and external stakeholders - which served as avenues for the comprehensive identification of issues and concerns with corresponding interventions and programs – the Executive-Legislative Agenda was formulated. Being the unifying tool of both the executive and legislative departments of the local government, the City of Muntinlupa’s Executive-Legislative Agenda (ELA) for 2020-2022 contains both priority thrusts of the executive branch led by Mayor Jaime R. Fresnedi with complementing legislative interventions proposed by the legislative branch led by Vice Mayor Artemio A. Simundac.

Being capacitated on the Updated Guideline of the Formulation of ELA, as per DILG Memorandum dated July 26, 2016, the participants discussed and agreed on the priority thrusts and agenda covering 2020 up to 2022. (Further documentation of workshop available in Annex – to add).
