MUNTINLUPA CITY GAD PLAN AND BUDGET CY 2015

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS, COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

FINDINGS:

- The prescribed GAD Plan and Budget template was used.
- Total LGU budget not indicated in the plan; hence, it cannot be readily determined if the allocated GAD budget for 2015 is within the 5% minimum requirement.
- There are several PPAs included in the plan that do not address clearly defined gender issues and are in fact part of the City's regular programs. It should be noted that the GAD fund should be allocated to and utilized for PPAs implemented to address gender issues. However, attribution to the GAD budget may also be done provided that the Harmonized Gender and Development Guidelines (HGDG) is administered to determine if they qualify as gender sensitive or gender responsive PPAs. Otherwise, these cannot be charged to the 5% GAD budget.
- There are elements of the GAD Plan that are not logically aligned. For instance some of the gender issues identified and the causes provided are logically related. The same was observed in some of the performance indicators and targets. Planners should make sure that the indicators and targets are in sync and that the activities to be undertaken would enable the LGU to achieve its objectives and address the issues affecting its constituents.
- There are vaguely stated gender issues and performance indicators, therefore, requires revision.
 Issues and indicators should be clearly defined, stated and specific.
- There are activities indicated in the plan that were not provided with corresponding performance indicators and targets. It should be understood that performance targets are an important consideration in budgeting as they specify what the LGU's GPB intends to achieve for a specific period (say one year) with regard to the GAD objective. Performance targets should, therefore, be specific, clear and carefully chosen. It is also necessary that for each activity a performance indicator and target is identified. Indicators shall serve as measures of success and are very crucial in tracking the progress of the PPA implementation. A quantitative and qualitative indicator may be indentified to for each activity.

 There are lumped budget. It is required that a corresponding budget is indicated for each identified activity. The plan should reflect every amount allocated for the conduct of an activity.

RECOMMENDATION/S:

- It is strongly recommended that the City Gender Focal Point System (GFPS) undergo a comprehensive orientation on Gender and Development and the Localization of the Magna Carta of Women.
- Establish/maintain an updated GAD database as this would greatly help the City GFPS in identifying pressing gender issues in the locality and in responding to/addressing such issues thru the implementation of genuinely gender sensitive/responsive PPAs.
- Re-examine the plan and carefully consider PPAs that truly address gender gaps/issues in the locality.
