**PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF
THE PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF MUNTINLUPA AND
PARENTS AND GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS IN GRADE ONE AND IN GRADE SEVEN
RECEIVING SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS**

WHEREAS, the City Government of Muntinlupa (CGM) launched a project to grant full scholarship to all students in Grade One and financial assistance to Grade Seven students in public schools in Muntinlupa;

WHEREAS, the CGM wishes to impress upon these parents and guardians that they have responsibilities to their children and wards and they have civic roles to play in the community;

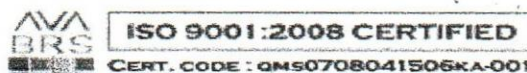
WHEREAS, the CGM, in implementing the scholarship program, promotes and supports the Parental Responsibility Agreement as a way to encourage self-reliance, value formation and family discipline, as a condition to enjoy the scholarship program, and as a measure of academic progress of the students concerned;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jaime R. Fresnedi, City Mayor of Muntinlupa, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby declare and ordain that:

Section 1. Parental Responsibility Agreement.

The Parental Responsibility Agreement (the Agreement, *for brevity*) is an instrument between the City Government of Muntinlupa (CGM) and the parent or guardian of the Grade One student or Grade Seven student wherein the following stipulations shall be included, namely:

- a. Civic Duty.
Commitment on the part of the parent or guardian to
- a.1 adhere to and follow all local ordinances;
 - a.2 remain a registered voter in the City of Muntinlupa;
 - a.3 permit participation of their children or wards in programs, projects, activities, including seminars, trainings and meetings, hosted or conducted by the CGM;

- a.4 avail of programs, projects and activities funded by the CGM, but in no instance take advantage of the same in order to earn financial gain;
 - a.5 return to the CGM or its appropriate department, office or instrumentality any item of value after use or after the designated time allotted;
 - a.6 pay or settle any indebtedness incurred from any of the programs, projects or activities of the CGM on time and in full.
- b. Familial Duty.
Commitment on the part of the parent or guardian to
- b.1 answer and satisfy the basic needs of their children or wards;
 - b.2 ensure regular and uninterrupted school attendance of their children or wards;
 - b.3 work and earn a living for the upkeep of their family;
 - b.4 avoid and shun vices, acts of immorality, acts of violence, and other harmful acts against the family and community.

Section 2. Pain of Forfeiture of Benefits Accorded.

In the event that the parent or guardian fails to comply with any of the obligations set forth, without any justifiable reason therefor, the CGM may revoke the grant of benefits due the children or wards in question.

It is clear from the foregoing that civic duty is enjoined upon all citizens of the city. However, inasmuch as these parents and guardians are receiving benefits for their respective children and wards, all the more reason should they follow all rules and observe all decrees. Hence, the Agreement compels both parties to faithfully perform their respective duties, especially in the course of the grant of scholarship and financial assistance.

Section 3. Exemptions.

The CGM may waive any of the requirements that warrant exemptions from the foregoing, provided any of the following conditions exists, namely:

- a. Financial Disability;
- b. Physical Disability;
- c. Mental Disorder;
- d. Family Emergency Conditions;

- e. Calamities and disasters, both natural and man-made; and
- f. Other similarly-situated circumstances.

The determination of the veracity of any of the abovementioned exemption shall be determined by the department or office of the CGM that has the expertise and familiarity therewith.

Section 4. Lead Office.

The People's Coordinating Office (PCO) shall conduct a Mandatory Information Dissemination and Education Campaign (MIDEC) among all stakeholders within a specified period of time, duly approved by the City Mayor, for the first phase of the implementation of this program. However, the PCO shall endeavor to continue the MIDEC thereafter in order to attract more involvement among all parents and guardians.

The PCO shall likewise take the lead in securing approval and signatures of the PRA for each parent or guardian concerned. Its staff members shall regularly monitor the compliance of each signatory parent and guardian to the PRA. It shall coordinate with other departments and offices of the CGM to ensure full compliance and with other agencies, including barangays, whenever warranted. Lastly, it shall periodically submit detailed reports to the Office of the City Mayor, copy furnished the Office of the City Administrator.

Section 5. Separability Clause.

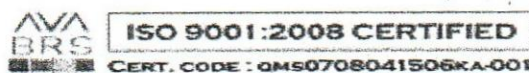
Any provision hereof found or held illegal, invalid or unsound shall not affect other provisions, which shall remain in full force.

Section 6. Effectivity.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing, and it shall remain in full force until revoked, rescinded, amended or superseded accordingly.
