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The labor and employment issues fall under the concern of formal labor. Formal labor is concerned with institutional labor arrangements that provide equitable opportunities, social protection and decent jobs to all workers. Employment that is inclusive and free from gender-based discrimination, particularly for people belonging to the marginalized sectors and other vulnerable groups is desired. This includes the full integration of all informal workers, particularly of women workers, in formal labor arrangements to ensure decent jobs and social protection. All graduating Senior High School, Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET), and tertiary level students qualify as new entrants to the work force needs orientation on the general labor standards and social benefits program of the government. It is often observed that new entrants in the workplace are unaware of the laws that supports and protects their welfare thus propagating discrimination and inequality. 

Republic Act 7610: Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act. Sec. 2. Declaration of State Policy and Principles. — It is hereby declared to be the policy of the State to provide special protection to children from all firms of abuse, neglect, cruelty exploitation and discrimination and other conditions, prejudicial their development; provide sanctions for their commission and carry out a program for prevention and deterrence of and crisis intervention in situations of child abuse, exploitation and discrimination. Overview

Kalingang Munti Action Center (KMAC) is a reinforced and improvised 'Pakay System' frontline services dedicated to provide grant assistance to the resident of the City Government of Muntinlupa.

Mandates

Under Executive Order No. 1 Series of 2022, the Kalinga Center will centralize and streamline the frontline services of the City Government including, but not limited to the grant of financial assistance, medical assistance, burial assistance, and other related services to resident and inhabitants of the local government. To integrate particular frontline services currently provided by the Mayor's Office, Social Services Department (SSD), Community Affairs and Development Office (CADO), and the People's Coordinating Office (PCO).

 To implement one (1) day processing for simple transactions from application to release of assistance;
 To provide organized and systematic processing of assistance
