#### B. BACKGROUND

The Muntinlupa Scholarship Program (MSP) remains to be committed to its mandate, as embodied in the City Ordinance No.17-107, to encourages and supports the quality of education of its citizens through programs for basic and tertiary education. It also recognizes the efforts of the academic achievers and board topnotchers in Muntinlupa through the City Education Recognition Program.

#### C. PROJECT COMPONENTS/ACTIVITIES

The Muntinlupa Scholarship Program under the Office of the City Mayor led the implementation of the High School and Elementary, Junior and senior high schools in the City, on their daily needs. The goal of the program is to eradicate the incidence of dropping-out most especially to male learners.

Economic and financial difficulty remain as one of the reasons why learners are dropping out and leaving school. Even if education is practically free for all, parents are continuously confronted with daily expense for fares, "baon" (allowance), food, school projects, among others.

In order to address these problems, on January 2020 the City Government amended the City Ordinance to 17-107 to City Ordinance 2020-0154, an ordinance increasing the annual allowance of the beneficiaries to wit:



SCHOOL LEAVER RATE (ELEMENTARY)






