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Republic Act 7610: Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act. Sec. 2. Declaration of State Policy and Principles. – It is hereby declared to be the policy of the State to provide special protection to children from all firms of abuse, neglect, cruelty exploitation and discrimination and other conditions, prejudicial their development; provide sanctions for their commission and carry out a program for prevention and deterrence of and crisis intervention in situations of child abuse, exploitation and discrimination. The State shall intervene on behalf of the child when the parent, guardian, teacher or person having care or custody of the child fails or is unable to protect the child against abuse, exploitation and discrimination or when such acts against the child are committed by the said parent, guardian, teacher or person having care and custody of the same. It shall be the policy of the State to protect and rehabilitate children gravely threatened or endangered by circumstances which affect or will affect their survival and normal development and over which they have no control. The best interests of children shall be the paramount consideration in all actions concerning them, whether undertaken by public or private social welfare institutions, courts of law, administrative authorities, and legislative bodies, consistent with the principle of First Call for Children as enunciated in the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child. A. **PROJECT TITLE:** MUNTINLUPA SCHOLARSHIP DIVISION – HIGH SCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY LEARNERS PROGRAM (HELP) AND OTHER EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

B. BACKGROUND

The Muntinlupa Scholarship Division (MSD), formerly known as the Muntinlupa Scholarship Program, upholds its unwavering commitment to its mandate, vision, and mission as articulated in the Scholarship ordinance, which underscores the Division's primary goal of stimulating, encouraging, and sustaining educational opportunities for Muntinlupeños, ensuring that every student is equipped with the necessary tools to secure a brighter future. Through its various programs, projects, and activities, the MSD guarantees equitable access to quality education for all residents of Muntinlupa.

To reinforce the sustainability and continuity of this vital educational initiative, the 9th City Council enacted City Ordinance No. 2021-238, which formally institutionalized the Muntinlupa Scholarship Division under the Office of the City Mayor. This move underscores the city government's dedication to providing structured and long-term support for its scholars, solidifying MSD's role as the official financial educational assistance arm of the local government.

Education remains a top priority in Muntinlupa City under the "Karunungan" pillar of Mayor Ruffy Biazon's 7K Agenda, which focuses on holistic community development. In line with this agenda, several amendments have been made to the existing scholarship ordinance to broaden the scope and improve the educational assistance offered to Muntinlupeños. These amendments reflect the city's proactive approach in addressing the evolving educational needs of its constituents, ensuring that no resident is left behind in pursuing academic success and personal growth.

C. PROJECT COMPONENTS/ACTIVITIES

The Muntinlupa Scholarship Division under the Office of the City Mayor led the implementation of the High School and Elementary Learners Program (HELP) and other educational assistance, program which aims to financially support male and female learners in Basic Education to Post Graduate Studies, on their educational needs. The goal of the program is to eradicate the incidence of dropping out most especially to male learners.







The economic and financial difficulty remains as one of the reasons why learners are dropping out and leaving school. According to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), the Philippines is currently experiencing high inflation. In August 2023, the inflation rate was 6.3%, the highest level over four years. This is due to several factors, including rising food and energy prices, the weakening peso, and supply chain disruptions. This can have a significant impact on the ability to afford an education and can make it more difficult for them to graduate.

As the flagship program of the City Government, full support was given by the Local Chief Executive (LCE) and the City Council. This is attested by appropriating and approving Php 500 million funds for the whole program. Muntinlupa Scholarship Division remains committed to its Vision: to grant financial leeway for poor but deserving students in the City for education related needs. The target beneficiaries for the Fiscal Year 2024 were 80,000 learners (40,000 males, 40,000 females).

Aligning with Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 17—Partnership for the Goals—the MSD recognizes the importance of partnerships in achieving its objectives. On September 8, 2023, the MSD held a meeting with the Scholarship Committee, comprising 60 coordinators and 27 principals from Muntinlupa public schools (20 male and 67 female coordinators).

MAJOR ACTIVITIES as agreed between MSD and the Scholarship Committee:

- 1. **Creation of the Scholarship Committee** as per City Ordinance No. 2023-099.
- 2. Opening of the Application and Updating Period.
- 3. **Reduction of Requirements for New Applicants,** limiting submissions to a newly issued school ID and Care Card only.
- 4. Acceptance and Screening of Applications by the School Coordinators.
- 5. Endorsement of the List of Scholars from school coordinators to MSD.
- 6. **Validation and Processing of Allowances** through the Mayor's Office, Budget Office, Accounting Office, and Treasury Office.
- 7. Establishment of Grounds for Disqualification from the Scholarship.

The Scholarship Committee, comprising coordinators and school principals from each public school in Muntinlupa, was created to strengthen the screening, evaluation, recommendation, and selection of scholarship recipients. This committee also aims to support the expansion of scholarship coverage by identifying non-scholars, proposing interventions to address various issues, and recommending policy innovations to improve the program further.

Additionally, the MSD has partnered with Landbank of the Philippines for the use of the PISO (Perang Inimpok Savings Option) account. This partnership aims to streamline the distribution of financial assistance to College scholars, ensuring that funds are securely and efficiently disbursed. The use of the PISO account also promotes financial literacy among scholars by encouraging them to manage their funds responsibly.

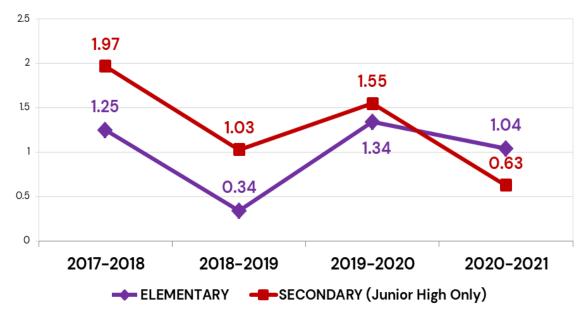

While the MSD Office do not take credit to the improving access data of Muntinlupa public school students with regard to dropping-out, attendance and completion rates, it can have said that the implementation of our financial assistance has positive correlation. Also, since lockdown and restrictions have been eased, resumption of classes has been ratified.

DROP-OUT RATE

The drop-out rate provides the percentage of students unable to finish a particular grade/year level and students unable to continue going to school within duration of classes. Elementary drop-out rate from SY 2019-2020 (1.34%) decreased by .30% in SY 2020-2021 (1.04%) while for the secondary level drop-out rates, a .92% decreased (from 1.55% to 0.63%) was also recorded.



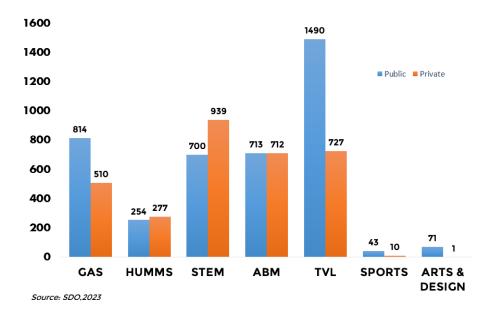

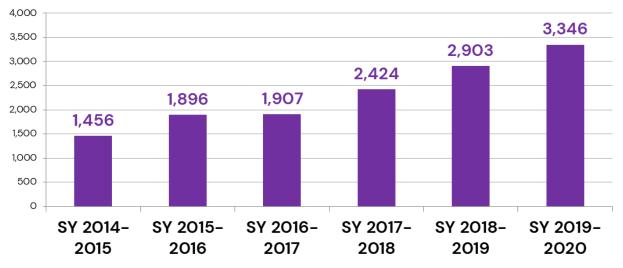




SDO-Muntinlupa Data on SHS Graduates (SY 2021-2022)

ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

1. **MEDICAL FINANCIAL AND BURIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM** – A Program under the Office of the City Mayor that provides financial aid to residents of Muntinlupa to help cover the cost of hospitalization, medicines, medical treatment, laboratory and diagnostic tests, purchase of medical devices and implants, funeral and burial expenses.

2. RATIONALE/BACKGROUND

The Kalingang Munti Action Center (KMAC) is one of the City's social service arms. Created through Executive Order No. 01 Series of 2022-B, it's primary purpose is to centralize and streamline all frontline services of the City Government, including the grant of financial medical and burial assistance to residents and inhabitants of Muntinlupa City.

The establishment of KMAC is a response to the pronouncement in the Philippine Constitution that directs the government to protect and promote people's right to health as well the provisions stated in Section 17 of Republic Act 9710 or the Magna Carta of Women to provide for a comprehensive, culture-sensitive, and gender-responsive health services and programs covering all stages of a woman's life cycle and Section 20 of City Ordinance No. 15-114 or the Gender and Development (GAD) Code of the City of Muntinlupa which states that the City Government shall pursue programs on the elements of reproductive health such as treatment of breast and reproductive tract cancers and other gynecological conditions, male involvement in reproductive health and prevention and treatment of infertility and sexual dysfunction.

Since it started operation in October 2022, KMAC has addressed critical gaps between people and basic social services by providing timely financial aid to individuals and families, helping them cope and recover from various crisis situations.

3. PROGRAM COMPONENTS/ACTIVITIES

Since October 2022, KMAC has received and processed about 38,000 financial assistance requests. As of this writing, the amount of assistance released to residents of Muntinlupa has already totaled to PhP144,177,076.00.

The Gender and Development Office's support has been instrumental in propelling KMAC's success in promoting comprehensive access to health and basic services to Muntinlupeňos. This can be attested by the continuous increase in clients serviced by the program.

Further, this program also seeks to advance the right of every Muntinlupeňo, man, woman, child, elderly, and those who identify as LGBTQIA+ to free, responsive,







efficient, and effective services through the grant of medical financial and burial assistance.

5. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

A monthly, quarterly, and semestral report indicating the number of beneficiaries and the amount released shall be submitted by KMAC to the City Mayor and Gender and Development Office.

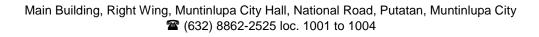

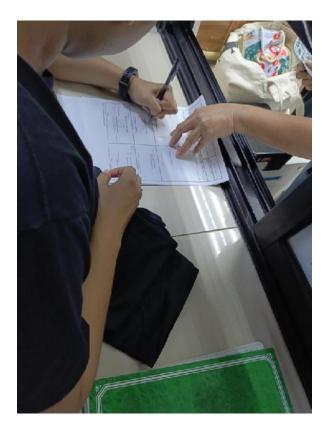

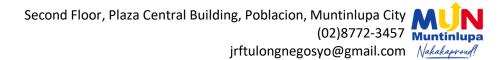

ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

1. A BUSINESS CAPITAL LOAN FOR MUNTINLUPEÑOS (Simulang Kapital and Dagdag Puhunan)

2. RATIONALE/BACKGROUND

The Muntinlupa Entrepreneurship Financing Division came to existence as per urgency to address the poverty crisis in Muntinlupa City. The directive is initiated by the City Mayor whose primary objective is to be of help to the group of low-income entrepreneurs in the city. The need to create a technical working team who would conceptualize mechanisms have been formed through constant meetings with collaborative stakeholders both from the local government department head, national key agencies and private sectors. Immediate area evaluation and surveys were established for validation to properly address a mechanism for poverty reduction. Heightened by the evidence of results and urgency, the chairman of the Majority Floor Leader of the City Council, sponsored and vitalized Executive Order 15-136, a City Ordinance establishing the JOINT RESOURCES FINANCING PROGRAM, a zero-interest capital loan assistance to a start-up and low-income entrepreneurs (micro-entrepreneurs), a program initiated by the then Mayor now Congressman Jaime R. Fresnedi.

On March 2022, the creation of the program as a Division with the City Ordinance No. 2022-335 which states: *"The Joint Resources Financing Program (JRFP) is hereby created by this ordinance as Division under the Office of the City Mayor"*. The institutionalization of the program is to ensure the continuous provision of loan assistance to the Muntipreneurs of the City.

While in January 2023, under the Ordinance No. which states, "*The renaming of the Joint Resources Financing Program Division to Muntinlupa Entrepreneurship Financing Division*". The purpose is that from, "Dagdag Puhunang Walang Tubo" now with another Loan Category, "SiKap (Simulang Kapital)" as initiated by Mayor Rozzano Rufino B. Biazon to fully address the poverty incidences and lessen the unemployment rate in the city.

3. PROJECT COMPONENTS/ACTIVITIES

A. Dagdag Puhunan

Since 2014, the total Loan Release amounted to P202,573,000.00 to a total of 7,737 (including the SLPA). Currently, the total number of released loan is 15,727. Even the pandemic hits, the City Government of Muntinlupa through the Muntinlupa Entrepreneurship Financing Division never stopped granting additional capitalization to micro entrepreneurs. The effectivity of the program and the profitability of micro businesses were proven through the current repayment rate of 92.48% of the total loan released. However, continuous improvement of the program and the businesses of the beneficiaries were still our priorities.





B. Sikap Kabuhayan Program

(Entrepreneurial and Skills Training with Starter Kit Grant)

Sikap Kabuhayan Program is a livelihood program which includes skills training on a specific trade or industry, as well as Entrepreneurial Training in partnership with Muntinlupa City Technical Institute, Gender and Development Office, PESO, DA-ESO, and i-STAR Program through TESDA-CocaCola.

Qualifications:

- 1. An active registered resident of Muntinlupa.
- 2. Must be 21-65 years old.
- 3. A permanent resident or renter of at least 5 years in Muntinlupa City.
- 4. With no existing record or loan with Dagdag Puhunan Program.
- 5. Should undergo and pass the assessment and selection process.
- 6. Must be willing to commit and become an entrepreneur.

C. (SIKAP) SImulang KAPital Loan

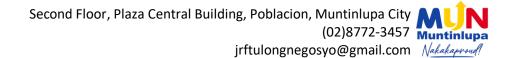
To commercialize a business, one must have start-up capital to use in rental fees, purchase of inventory, permits, marketing, and any other operational expense. With the help of Business Plan, a Start-Up Business can forecast what will be needed to put up the business. Through the SiKap (Simulang Kapital) Loan, the beneficiary will have access to financial resources to become micro entrepreneurs.

Qualifications:

- Must be a registered voter of Muntinlupa.
- ► With Muntinlupa Care Card
- ▶ 21-60 years old
- ► A permanent resident or renter of at least 3 years in Muntinlupa City.

► Has completed the Entrepreneurial trainings/seminar from GAD/MCTI/other Government Offices/partner private institutions with certificate.

► Recipient of starter kit grant (with on-going product testing and improvement)- preferably from Sikap Kabuhayan Program and partner offices.



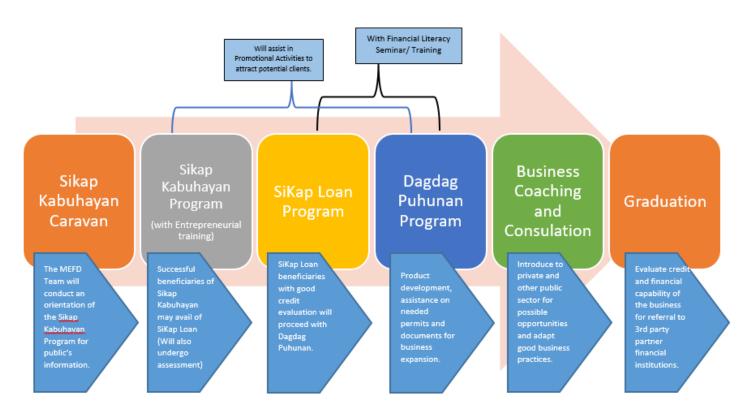




These projects will help in addressing the unemployment, and underemployment rate and poverty incidences in the City by giving opportunity to potential future business owners with proper entrepreneurial skills through continuous trainings and seminars, and access to resources through the zero-interest loan capitalization.

In evidence to the women empowerment that the program is promoting and encouraging our clients to attend the Sari-Sari Store Training and Access to Resources (STAR) Program. It helps them boost their entrepreneurial skills and to have a formal training on how to handle different issues with their store. Until the program is open also with men participants. And to extend the support of the MEFD Program, a memorandum was created for the allotment of budget for the STAR Program. As of 2019, there a total of 1,065- women and 138- men had graduated from the program.

Now, in accordance to the new normal processes, the previously STAR Program shifted into iSTAR Program where everything will be done on line. Orientations, meetings, briefing, and most of all modular activities were conducted via internet. Modules to be answered are downloadable at the website. These can be accessed through android and ios phones, as well tablets, computers and laptops.
